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NEW LEADERSHIP, NEW CHATPER FOR FUL

In July 2022, we welcomed our new Executive Director, Darnell Hamilton.

Darnell came to Future Urban Leaders with fifteen years as an experienced educator in the secondary education system with a demonstrated aptitude for empowering young people to take control of their lives.

One of the core strengths Darnell also brings is his authentic approach towards relationship building. In the first few months with our organization, we are excited about the new relationships we have developed to provide more opportunities for our students.

When asked about what the power in Future Urban Leaders is, Darnell said, "In meeting parents, scholars, team

members, volunteers, and board members, it is clear that the way in which the community shows up and comes together is the power of FUL. I've participated in a few events to kick off my introduction to FUL, and I am ecstatic to see the collaborative efforts amongst all involved. Whether or not the cameras are on, the joy I've witnessed on the faces of community members has made me aware that I am in for one fantastic experience. By coming into this space, I aim to maximize our collaborative efforts in order to deliver more powerful moments in our scholars' worlds."

As we look to the future of FUL, we are enthusiastic about having Darnell to lead our organization to help young people harness their untapped potential.







EXPLORING POSSIBILITY: SCIENCE, ART, AND PROJECT-BASED PROGRAMMING

Our Young Einstein's are our youngest scholars beginning in 4K and going to 2nd grade. In this program we take a STEAM-based approach to curriculum building, which allows our scholars to develop critical thinking skills and curiosity about the world around them at a young age.

2022 was a year of reset for our Young Einsteins program since pre-COVID times. In the second half of the 2021-2022 school year we were able to focus more about programming and providing our youngest scholars with intentional STEAM-based activities and aligning the STEAM-based activities with standard-based learning.

Our Young Einsteins Program Lead, Emily Ventola, was very intentional in allowing our scholars to have input on the types of programming she planned. We had no shortage of ideas!

STEAM activities our students love most are the exploratory, hands-on activities. Some examples of activities our Young Einstein's loved this year included; creating slime, science experiments (such as taking baking soda and little droppers of vinegar and food coloring to see how they react to each other), and art activities.

"We have been busy with the Young Einsteins building, creating, and exploring. I've been so happy to see how all of our scholars - even our littlest 4 year olds - have been able to engage in our activities and show off their creative energy!" -Emily Ventola, Young Einsteins Program Lead

When talking about the future of the program and what's in store for 2023, Emily shared, "I am really excited for some amazing plans we have for our Young Einsteins in the new year. We have some great art-based partnerships in the works and are planning some field trips for our youngest FUL scholars based around local artists. I'm really excited for our Young Einsteins to get out in the community and explore their creativity!"

PNEUMATICS AND HYDRAULICS WITH K'NEX

Our Pneumatics and Hydraulics with K'Nex program provides our 3rd - 5th grade students the opportunity to discover STEM by exploring and engineering through the fascinating science of pneumatics (air) and hydraulics (water) using components of K'Nex. We are honored to have Tonet Johnson, a veteran science teacher and Lego Robotics coach at Milwaukee College Prep as the program lead for this class.

The program allows students to work as a team to build different pneumatic and hydraulic machines. Each build requires students to work with one another and select and execute specific roles within the group, make and test their predictions, discuss adjustments to their machines, design and implement enhancements for better performance, and experience first hand the steps of the scientific method.


Some of the activities & machines built throughout this 2022 in this program included;

- a castle that has four walls, two turrets, and a drawbridge
- a pneumatic launcher that will send a rocket 2 feet into the air
- a pneumatic submarine that can go up and down in the water as the air pressure increases and decreases
- a pneumatic catapult that will launch a missile at least three feet
- a car that is powered by air
- a hydraulic dump truck that can lift and dump a load
- a hydraulic digger that can lift various objectives









CEOS OF 2MRO

CEOs of 2mro is our entrepreneur class for our FUL Intern students. CEOs of 2mro will provide opportunities for scholars to gain knowledge and insight to not only starting a business but running a business. Through interactive activities, students will brainstorm their ideas which will prepare them to actually launch a business.

CEOs of 2mro is led by Kaija Miller-Kyles, creator and owner of Kai Mone't Consulting. Ms. Miller-Kyles is a graduate of the University Of Wisconsin Whitewater and served six years in the United States Army National Guard and has been a business owner going on six years.

"Hearing the students actively talking about starting their business and being excited as we add on additional steps. They fully understand how setting goals and planning can lead them to much success," stated Kaija Miller-Kyles, CEOs of 2mro Program Leader.

Over the course of the 12-week program, students will have: set intentional goals, determined their business market, learned about their ideal customer, created a lean

business plan (including marketing strategies), and know how to file their business in the state of Wisconsin, and potential startup costs.

For students and their families, CEOs of 2mro has made room for conversations such as salaries, career paths, future goals, and different aspects of entrepreneurial life between scholars and their parents.

Lisa, the mother of FUL Intern Jay shared, "Jay would come home asking me, "Mom, what's your annual salary? We have had conversations about who he wants to become, job salaries, different career paths, and more about his life beyond college."


CEOs of 2mor is helping scholars to think of different possibilities and choices for life beyond college. Jay is an avid video game lover. Before CEOs of 2mro, Jay wanted to be a professional video game player. After learning more about the earning potential,

and other factors, Jay now wants to be a CEO of a video game design company.

"I hope to continue seeing students grow and ask questions about how they can expand their business idea to make it a reality in the coming years. Some have ideas that, if pursued by those

Jackson, a FUL senior, has been a scholar with Future Urban Leaders since sixth grade.

"My favorite aspect of FUL is the family. The family that the staff and the program builds. There is something special

about having the older students, like myself and other juniors and seniors, that are able to interact with the middle school and young kids."

Jackson was one of the twelve students that participated in FUL's 2022 HBCU Trip this past summer. One of the colleges visited on the trip was Morgan State University in Baltimore.

"The HBCU trip definitely helped me realize that Morgan State was a perfect fit for me with civil engineering being a primary area of study," stated Jackson.

After graduation, Jackson is planning to study civil engineering and Morgan State is one of the schools in his 'Top 3' list that he would like to attend.

"Future Urban Leaders keep us consistent by constantly checking in on us in all aspects of our education and life. At our weekly meetups, we are being asked about our current grades, how we are doing with applying for financial aid, where we are at with college applications, etc."

Over the years as a FUL scholar, the different experiences and opportunities she has been able to participate in is one of her favorite parts of Future Urban Leaders. In addition to new opportunities, the real relationships built within FUL have been most impactful.

"The staff talk to you outside of FUL programming, they truly care about me as a person. I know that if I would text Mr.Krueger or Mr. Romenesko for help, they would respond," Jamaria shared.

Jamaria has known since she was young that she wanted to attend Howard University in Washington D.C. After attending the 2022 HBCU Trip, she was able to visit Howard University and learned quickly that the campus wasn't the perfect fit she dreamed it to be. Jamilia stated, "I wanted to go to Howard and when we got there it wasn't the area I wanted to be."

The HBCU Trip was one of Jamaria's favorite experiences with FUL, along with Future Cities as a younger scholar, and College Prep as a high school scholar.

"I like the Wednesday night College Prep class for a number of reasons. Some weeks it is nice to have a place to go to chill and be with good people I haven't seen in a while. Other weeks, I go into Wednesday nights needing help and I am able to sit down and focus on school work or other college prep materials."


PARTNERSHIPS HIGHLIGHTS

JLH SOCIAL IMPACT FUND

The Jrue and Lauren Holiday Social Impact Fund mission is to boldly create change for Black businesses and organizations. In 2021, Future Urban Leaders was a JLH Social Fund Grantee as one of Milwaukee's Black-led nonprofits. In September 2022, our Executive Director was asked to speak on the impact of FUL's work with young people in the Milwaukee community.

This event was an amazing opportunity to meet other Black-led, and Black-owned businesses in the Milwaukee area and to network with organizations with shared missions to ours.




GATHERING PLACE

Gathering Place Brewery is an award winning, community centered craft brewery located in Milwaukee's Riverwest neighborhood. In November 2022, they partnered with FUL by offering us 20% of their Thursday night sales, as they look to see change occur for Milwaukee's community.

UW- MILWAUKEE COLLEGE FOR KIDS & TEENS

FUL's partnership with UWM College for Kids & Teens began 7 years ago. UWM College for Kids & Teens provided the opportunity for our scholars to take summer courses on the UWM campus. There are over 200 courses, taught by UW-Milwaukee system faculty, centered within Creative Arts, Social Sciences, Languages & Cultures, Math & Computers, and Science.

In 2023, we are looking forward to expanding our partnership by registering some of our high school students into specific Certificate programs, including School of Architecture and Urban Planning, Art and Design, and Data Science. We also look to register some of our middle and high school students for the UWM Writing Project, an active chapter of the National Writing Project (NWP).

Our annual cash raffle held on St. Patrick's Day brought in over \$1,000 to support our programming. This wasn't our biggest year for our raffle but we were happy to see some new individuals participating!


DONOR APPRECIATION GALA - NOV. 5, 2022




